

A reflection for Women's History month

No man has ever told me that I cannot do something because I am a woman. Well, there was that one little boy on the playground, but he doesn't count. However, marketing and other women have clearly set the rules regarding what it takes to be a successful woman.

For the span of my life (51 and counting), I have been taught by the women in my family that you can do and be anything a man can do (or be). To get it, you have to be smart, strong, determined, and ready to sacrifice. As the years have passed, I have been witness to the rise and fall of the women around me that have challenged the status quo, rose through the ranks, and sat down to firmly ask themselves "Was it worth it?" I have watched women play it safe, afraid to "rock the boat", look at their lives now with regret. Was it worth it?

Since the onset of Covid, women have looked around at the enforced confinement and have begun to reevaluate their world and more often than not, the answer is "No."

You can work as hard as your male counterparts, but you will feel guilt that is not commonly associated with your male counterparts. A working mom has the "why are you so selfish" guilt. The stay-at-home mom has the "why aren't you bringing in income" guilt. A working mom, traditionally has to work 40-60 hours per week (often, this is more) and then switch gears to run the house, the family and keep up with the children's extracurricular activities. The stay at home mom is guilt-tripped into taking on a million and one extra tasks for schools, extracurricular activities, their children's PTO's, and every other darned thing that needs to be done because "well, you have all of that free time because you don't work!".

For the "gentler and fairer" sex, we pile an awfully heavy

burden on them and expect them to carry the load of a mule train! When we finally fall into bed, exhausted, we feel guilt there, too. There are body dysmorphic mindsets, the "Cosmo" magazine "how to be a better wife", the unrealistic beauty standards that have created millions and even our 8-year-old girls are using "filters" to meet unrealistic ideals. (Thank you, Snapchat)

But what does it all add up to? The women of the world to-day have spent their entire lives living up to other people's standards and expectations. This is the largest obstacle. And by an obstacle, I mean mountain. Or solid brick wall. Our young women spend their teens so filled with loathing and anxiety that most teenagers are suffering from poor self-image and panic attacks. Our 20-somethings are trying to "live their best lives" and compare success to their realistic counterparts, the Jenners and Kardashians. Our 30-something women are desperately trying to check all of the boxes. Supermom? Check. Super-Spouse? Check. Own my house? Check. Great career? Check. Provider, Independent Diva, Boss B#@\$, Leader of the Pack? Check and check. Self-Care? Ha!

Right now, your Gen-X women are in their 40's and 50's and have begun to realize and share the secret of success with the younger generation. Having it all comes at a cost. And that cost is you. The biggest obstacle we face? These are the obstacles that we accept by believing everyone else's definition of success. And as for breaking the glass ceiling. Go ahead and do that if you want. But be prepared...when the glass ceiling breaks, that is just one more thing you will have to clean up.



My fellow Assemblywomen and I have made great strides in making political participation more representative and accessible to everyone. Yet, the work is far from over. Women still make up only one third of our Assembly here in New York; that needs to change. It is vital to the health of our democracy that everyone sees themselves represented fairly and materially in our governing and judicial processes. With women making up over half of the population of New York, we still have a way to go---and I can't do it alone.

Diverse representation allows for diverse perspectives, which allows for unmet needs to finally be heard. The pandemic has shown that the need for childcare, for example, is something that impacts everyone, however women were disproportionately impacted. Women unfairly absorbed the impact of the unavailability of childcare during school shutdowns to the detriment of their careers and businesses. Women in government are acutely aware of this issue, which is one reason I moved legislation that incentivizes more businesses to have onsite daycare to better accommodate their employees. Having more women in government will lead to more equitable solutions that we will all benefit from. We can all be the change that New York needs. With your involvement, little girls everywhere are presented with yet another example of what political empowerment can look like. In a nation where women's issues are often maligned, it has never been more important to have the voices of women amplified by our representatives! I am proud to represent you, and to be a part of the fight towards gender equity in all arenas, including political participation. We are one step closer every single day, and I know that with your help we can create a political landscape for our daughters that welcomes, supports, and empowers the next generation.
